Quote To Consider:

Jonathan Edwards:

“Some people actually imagine that the revelation in God’s Word is not enough to meet our needs. They think that God from time to time carries on an actual conversation with them, chatting with them, satisfying their doubts, testifying to His love for them, promising them support and blessings. As a result, their emotions soar; they are full of bubbling joy that is mixed with self-confidence and a high opinion of themselves. The foundation for these feelings, however, does not lie within the Bible itself, but instead rests on the sudden creations of their imaginations. These people are clearly deluded. God’s Word is for all of us and each of us; He does not need to give particular messages to particular people.”

- *While nature is doing something in verses 1-6, it can be said the Bible is something in verses 7-11. What is the Bible according to verses 7-11?

- *When Peter references the prophetic word in 2 Peter 1:19-21 he is referring primarily to the Old Testament Scriptures. Where does he say the Scriptures originated? Where did they not originate?
- What does Paul say in 2 Timothy 3:16 that is similar to 2 Peter 1:19-21?
- Based on these verses, where does the Bible derive its’ authority?
- *If we understand the Bible is God’s Word and therefore carries his authority what does that mean for our everyday life and practice?

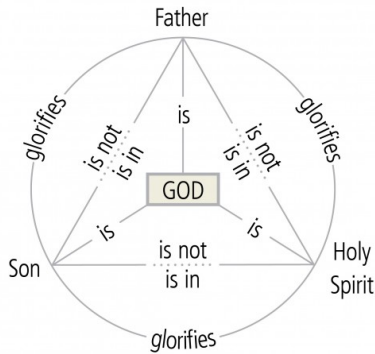

Doctrinal Focus: The Trinity



We believe there is but one God, the Maker, Preserver and Ruler of all things, having in and of Himself, all perfections, and being infinite in them all; and to Him all creatures owe the highest love, reverence and obedience.

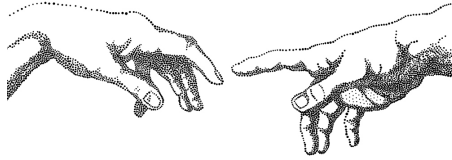

We believe that God is eternal, with no beginning or end and out of nothing God created everything (Ex Nihilo). He created everything for His glory. Man is the special creation of God, made in His own image (Imago Dei).

He created them male and female as the crowning work of His creation. God created mankind male and female as the crowning work of His creation. The gift of gender is thus part of the goodness of God's creation.

Men and women are different. To some readers, this is obvious. To an increasing number of people, however, these are fighting words. The idea that men and women are basically, essentially different is passé. To argue further that these differences carve out different roles for men and women which include the “submission” word—let’s just say that won’t win you many friends at a dinner party.

EXCERPT NASHVILLE STATEMENT ON BIBLICAL SEXUALITY:¹

WE AFFIRM that God created Adam and Eve, the first human beings, in his own image, equal before God as persons, and distinct as male and female.

WE DENY that the divinely ordained differences between male and female render them unequal in dignity or worth.

1. What does it mean to be created in the image of God?
 - a. List out the attributes of God and discuss which ones are shared with humanity, which ones are not, and why does this matter?
2. How would you define “gender”?
3. How should we understand gender, marriage, and family?
4. **According to the Bible, gender is important to God. He created both male and female “in his image” (Genesis 1:27).**
5. **How do the 2 genders reflect the image of God?**²

¹ The Elders of the Fount affirm the Nashville Statement on Biblical Sexuality. While affirmation is not required for membership; we encourage you to prayerfully read this statement. If you have questions or concerns we gladly make ourselves available to discuss this important topic further with you.

² NOTE: We affirm there are only 2 genders assigned by God prior to conception and that the differences between male and female reproductive structures are integral to God’s design for self-conception as male or female (ie gender and sexuality are inescapably linked and are not a social or cultural construct).

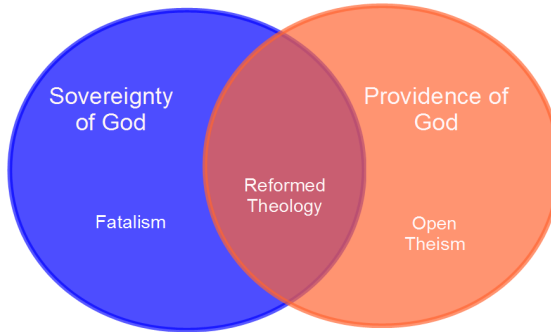

Doctrinal Focus: Providence & Sovereignty



We believe that God from eternity, decrees or permits all things that come to pass, and perpetually upholds, directs and governs all creatures and all events; yet so as not in any way to be the author or approver of sin nor to destroy the real moral agency and responsibility of intelligent creatures. God is all-powerful and all-knowing; and His perfect knowledge extends to all things past, present and future, including the future decisions of His creatures.

Doctrinal Focus: The Fall



We believe that God originally created the first man, Adam, and the first woman, Eve, in His own image, and free from sin.

God created mankind male and female as the crowning work of His creation. The gift of gender is thus part of the goodness of God's creation. But, through the temptation of Satan, Adam transgressed the command of God, and fell from his original holiness and righteousness; whereby his posterity inherit a nature corrupt and wholly opposed to God and His law, are under condemnation, and as soon as they are capable of moral action, become actual transgressors.
